


Safer Email


Email is the most often used app on the Internet, but it was never meant to be secure.

Here's how to stay safer.




Companies often sell or swap their customer lists.



Make each email password 100% unique and at least eight characters long.





When you receive a suspicious email at work, alert IT.

Across all industries, this reduces detection time of a breach from 146 days to 1 hour.



Clicking on links or open unsolicited attachments can infect your computer or phone.

Many viruses automatically forward the infected email to your entire email address book.



Remember: many emails you send can be intercepted and viewed by prying eyes.
