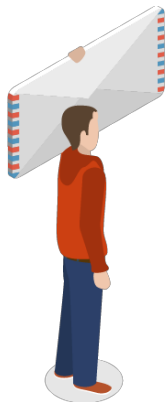


Safer Email

but it was never meant to be secure.

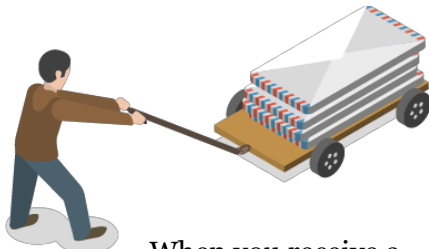
Which is why email is home to more than

lists.*

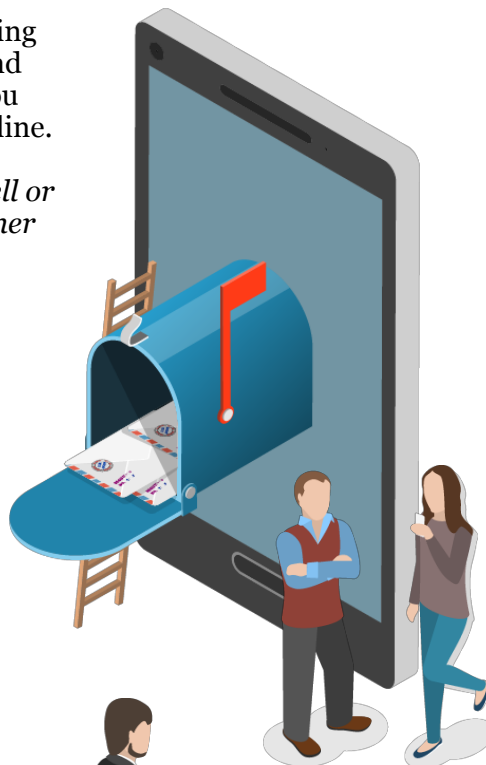


When you receive a

146 days to 1 hour.*

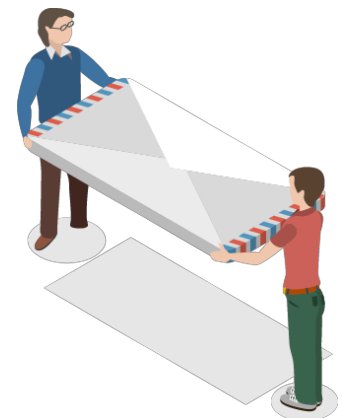
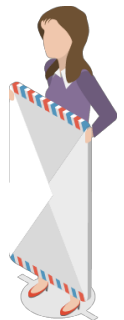


Remember: many emails you

*Make each email
password 100%
unique and at least
eight characters long.*



Clicking on links or open
unsolicited attachments can
infect your computer or phone.

forward the infected email to
your entire email address book.*
